SUBJECT: Declaration of a Public Health Emergency on Vandenberg SFB Terminated

- 1. On 20 March 2020, a Public Health Emergency was declared based on the public health situation involving Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19), and renewed the same on 17 April 2020, 15 May 2020, 4 August 2020, 16 October 2020, 13 January 2021, 12 April 2021, 25 July 2021, 10 September 2021 and again on 12 December 2021. I have consulted with my Public Health Emergency Officer (PHEO) regarding the current status of COVID-19. Based on the PHEO's recommendations and considering all circumstances, I am rescinding my declaration of a Public Health Emergency IAW AFI 10-2519, Public Health Emergencies and Incidents of Public Health Concern, and DoDI 6200.03, Public Health Emergency Management (PHEM) Within the DoD.
- 2. The Health Protection Condition (HPCON) status for the installation will be reduced from BRAVO+ to ALPHA as a result of termination of the Public Health Emergency. Accordingly, situational telework is no longer mandated.
- 3. Based on recently updated CDC guidelines, Santa Barbara County is currently "medium" in the COVID-19 Community Level. Based on this level and current CDC guidelines, vaccinated people are no longer required to wear a mask indoors. Vaccinated people will not be required to wear a mask indoors, unless the Santa Barabara Community level return to "high" under the CDC guidelines. All unvaccinated people over the age of 2 are still required to wear a mask indoors, regardless of the CDC Community Level.
- 4. All powers, authorities, and mandates under the Public Health Directives are hereby terminated. However, all policies from higher authorities remain in effect, including policies on vaccination, COVID-19 testing, gathering size, and travel.
