MEMORANDUM FOR ALL VANDENBERG DORMITORY RESIDENTS

SUBJECT: COVID-19 Rules for Dormitory Residents

- 1. To prevent the spread or transmission of COVID-19, it is important that we isolate dorm residents who have, or are believed to have the virus. Dorm residents experiencing the symptoms of COVID-19: fever, dry cough, or shortness of breath, must call the 30th Medical Group (30 MDG) immediately at 805-606-CARE (2273). After duty hours or on weekends, members must call their First Sergeant who will coordinate an escort to a medical treatment facility for testing, if necessary. The member will then contact the 30 MDG immediately on the next duty day. Dorm residents experiencing COVID-19 symptoms and requiring an escort must wear an approved mask that may be obtained from their First Sergeants and/or medical testing facility.
- 2. First Sergeants, or a designated unit representative, will immediately call 805-606-1844 to secure temporary quarters for dorm residents who have been tested for COVID-19 and who reside with roommates or suitemates. The tested dorm resident will be placed in isolation for precaution and/or recovery. Isolated dorm residents will monitor their health and report any progression of symptoms to the 30 MDG or dial 9-1-1 for a medical emergency. Roommates and suitemates of members who have been tested for COVID-19 will be immediately quarantined in their current living quarters. Notification of quarantine release will be made by their First Sergeants after consultation with the 30 MDG.
- 3. Dorm residents who are ill but who are not experiencing the symptoms of COVID-19 must immediately notify their First Sergeant. Unless otherwise directed by their commander, they must contact the 30 MDG at 805-606-CARE (2273), self-quarantine for 72 hours, reduce contact with roommates and suitemates, and clean/sanitize their common areas. These members will again call the 30 MDG after 72 hours for a reassessment of their status. Roommates and suitemates of dorm residents who are ill but who are not experiencing the symptoms of COVID-19 and who have not been tested for the virus, will not be quarantined but must reduce contact with the ill dorm resident.
- 4. Unit commanders are charged with providing for the general welfare of dorm residents in isolation and/or quarantine.
