What You Need to Know

- Coyotes play an important role in the ecosystem by preying on rodents.
- They are fearful of humans by nature; feeding them disrupts their normal behavior.
- Access to human/pet food and garbage changes their natural behavior and they lose fear of people.

Safety Tips

If You See a Coyote

- Do not approach — maintain a safe distance.
- Do not run — running may trigger a chase.
- Be loud and assertive — shout, clap, wave your arms, or use a whistle/air horn.
- Make yourself look bigger — stand tall, wave a jacket, or raise your arms.

Around Your Home/Office

- Never feed coyotes. Secure garbage, compost, and pet food.
- Supervise pets while they are outdoors, day or night.
- Remove attractants such as fallen fruit, bird seed, or spilled food.

When Walking Outdoors

- Keep children close and hold hands with younger kids.
- Keep pets on a short leash (not retractable).
- Carry a deterrent such as a whistle or small air horn.

If a Coyote Acts Aggressively

- Do not turn your back. Maintain eye contact and back away slowly.
- Stay loud and assertive. Throw small objects (not food) near the animal to scare it off.
